

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5303**

**OFFERED BY MR. SHUSTER OF PENNSYLVANIA**

Page 4, line 6, strike “dredges” and insert “manages the dredging of”.

Page 6, line 20, strike “missions” and insert “missions and authorities”.

Page 11, after line 24, insert the following:

**1 SEC. 109. REMOTE AND SUBSISTENCE HARBORS.**

2 Section 2006 of the Water Resources Development  
3 Act of 2007 (33 U.S.C. 2242) is amended—

4 (1) in subsection (a)(3) by inserting “in which  
5 the project is located, or the long-term viability of a  
6 community that is located in the region that is  
7 served by the project and that will rely on the  
8 project,” after “community”; and

9 (2) in subsection (b)—

10 (A) in paragraph (1) by inserting “and  
11 communities that are located in the region to be  
12 served by the project and that will rely on the  
13 project” after “community”;

1 (B) in paragraph (4) by striking “local  
2 population” and inserting “regional population  
3 to be served by the project”; and

4 (C) in paragraph (5) by striking “commu-  
5 nity” and inserting “local community and com-  
6 munities that are located in the region to be  
7 served by the project and that will rely on the  
8 project”.

Page 14, line 25, strike “cost sharing” and insert  
“cost-sharing”.

Page 20, line 3, strike “agreements” and insert  
“written agreements pursuant to section 221 of the  
Flood Control Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. 1962d–5b)”.

Page 23, lines 18 and 19, strike “any project” and  
insert “any components of a project”.

Page 25, after line 4, insert the following:

9 **SEC. 118. AGREEMENTS.**

10 Section 2036(c) of the Water Resources Development  
11 Act of 2007 (33 U.S.C. 2317b) is repealed.

Page 29, line 25, strike “2325a” and insert  
“2325a(a)”.

Page 32, line 23, strike “credits or”.

Page 38, lines 3 and 4, strike “regional governments,” and insert “regional districts,”.

Page 46, after line 20, insert the following:

1           “(2) provide written notice to previous and po-  
2           tential non-Federal interests and local elected offi-  
3           cials on the annual process and on opportunities to  
4           address local water resources challenges through the  
5           missions and authorities of the Corps of Engineers;

Page 51, line 19, through page 52, line 9, strike “requestor” each place it appears and insert “requester”.

Page 59, after line 19, insert the following:

6 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . USE OF NATURAL AND NATURE-BASED FEAT-**  
7 **TURES.**

8           (a) **REPORT.**—Not later than February 1, 2017, and  
9 biennially thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to the  
10 Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the  
11 House of Representatives and the Committee on Environ-  
12 ment and Public Works of the Senate a report on the use  
13 of natural and nature-based features in water resources  
14 development projects, including flood risk reduction, coast-  
15 al resiliency, and ecosystem restoration projects.

16           (b) **CONTENTS.**—The report shall include, at a min-  
17 imum, the following:

1           (1) An assessment of the observed and potential  
2           impacts of the use of natural and nature-based fea-  
3           tures on the cost and effectiveness of water re-  
4           sources development projects and any co-benefits re-  
5           sulting from the use of such features.

6           (2) A description of any statutory, fiscal, or  
7           regulatory barriers to the appropriate consideration  
8           and use of natural and nature-based features in car-  
9           rying out water resources development projects.

10 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . ANNUAL REPORT ON THE PURCHASE OF FOR-**  
11 **EIGN MANUFACTURED ARTICLES.**

12           Section 213(a) of the Water Resources Development  
13 Act of 1992 (Public Law 102–580; 106 Stat. 4831) is  
14 amended by adding at the end the following:

15           “(4) ANNUAL REPORT ON THE PURCHASE OF  
16 FOREIGN MANUFACTURED ARTICLES.—

17           “(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90  
18 days after the last day of each fiscal year, the  
19 Secretary shall submit to Congress a report on  
20 the amount of acquisitions in such fiscal year  
21 made by the Corps of Engineers for civil works  
22 projects from entities that manufactured the ar-  
23 ticles, materials, or supplies outside of the  
24 United States.

1           “(B) CONTENTS.—The report required  
2           under subparagraph (A) shall indicate, for each  
3           acquisition—

4                   “(i) the dollar value of any articles,  
5                   materials, or supplies purchased that were  
6                   manufactured outside of the United States;  
7                   and

8                   “(ii) a summary of the total procure-  
9                   ment funds spent on goods manufactured  
10                  in the United States and the total procure-  
11                  ment funds spent on goods manufactured  
12                  outside of the United States.

13           “(C) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—Not later  
14           than 30 days after the submission of a report  
15           under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall  
16           make such report publicly available on the  
17           agency’s Web site.”.

18 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . INTEGRATED WATER RESOURCES PLANNING.**

19           In carrying out a feasibility study for a water re-  
20           sources development project, the Secretary shall coordi-  
21           nate with communities in the watershed covered by such  
22           study to determine if a local or regional water manage-  
23           ment plan exists or is under development for the purposes  
24           of stormwater management, water quality improvement,  
25           aquifer recharge, or water reuse. If such a local or regional

1 water management plan exists for the watershed, the Sec-  
2 retary shall, in cooperation with the non-Federal sponsor  
3 for such plan and affected local public entities, avoid ad-  
4 versely affecting the purposes of the local water manage-  
5 ment plan and, where feasible, incorporate the purposes  
6 of the local plan into the Secretary’s feasibility study.

7 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . EVALUATION OF PROJECT PARTNERSHIP AGREE-**  
8 **MENTS.**

9 To the maximum extent practicable, the Secretary  
10 shall prioritize and complete the activities required of the  
11 Secretary under section 1013 of the Water Resources Re-  
12 form and Development Act of 2014 (Public Law 113–121;  
13 128 Stat. 1218).

14 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . ADDITIONAL MEASURES AT DONOR PORTS AND**  
15 **ENERGY TRANSFER PORTS.**

16 Section 2106 of the Water Resources Reform and De-  
17 velopment Act of 2014 (33 U.S.C. 2238c) is amended—

18 (1) in subsection (a)(4)(A) by striking “Code of  
19 Federal Regulation” and inserting “Code of Federal  
20 Regulations”; and

21 (2) in subsection (f)—

22 (A) in paragraph (1) by striking “2018”  
23 and inserting “2020”; and

24 (B) in paragraph (3)—

- 1 (i) by striking “2015 through 2018”  
2 and inserting “2016 through 2020”; and  
3 (ii) by striking “2019 through 2022”  
4 and inserting “2021 through 2025”.

Page 64, at the end of line 22, add the following:  
“In carrying out the feasibility study for the project, the  
Secretary shall include Reclamation District 17 as part  
of the study.”.

Page 65, after line 8, insert the following:

- 5 (8) Project for flood risk management, Rahway  
6 River Basin (Upper Basin), New Jersey.

Page 70, lines 18 through 19, strike “Governors”  
and insert “Governor”.

Page 82, after line 10, insert the following:

7 **SEC. 308. HUNTINGDON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall—

- 9 (1) prioritize the updating of the Master Plan  
10 for the Juniata River and tributaries project, Hun-  
11 tington County, Pennsylvania, authorized by section  
12 203 of the Flood Control Act of 1962 (Public Law  
13 87–874; 76 Stat. 1182); and  
14 (2) ensure that alternatives for additional recre-  
15 ation access and development at the project are fully

1        assessed, evaluated, and incorporated as a part of  
2        the update.

3        (b) PARTICIPATION.—The update referred to in sub-  
4        section (a) shall be done in coordination with all appro-  
5        priate Federal agencies, elected officials, and members of  
6        the public.
